After many years of waiting for approval by the Mexican government, finally the petition to create a new Religious Association came through!

Manny always said he would retire after the Religious Association was approved and the approval came just in time!

It was a long process, paperwork was sent, meetings were held with the lawyer and public notary, the applications were filled out and filled out again, plus more paperwork along with the anxiety of waiting for what else might be needed to be done before the Mexican

authorities would give the okay. On October 28, the ILBCM Religious Association under Mexican law was accepted.

The Board of Directors of the ILBCM consists of Omar P., Silvia M., Elisabeth P., Marina N., along with Ministers Romelio Perez, Josue Del Carmen and Bladimir Martinez.

Why is this Religious Association so important for the ministry in Mexico and LBCM? With this recognition, the lay pastors that have been supported and helped by LBCM now can form their own Bible Institute or theological school and then can be ordained as Ministers of the Word. Now the pastors and churches are registered as part of a specific church and they can perform religious duties openly. They have access to some social services. They are protected by the law. Another important aspect is that ILBCM will be able to add more churches and pastors and can grow and expand by opening new mission churches.

This Religious Association opens doors for both Pastors and congregations to preach the good news in their own setting and in public places. This is an accomplishment of the work that you and LBCM have been part of all these years.

There is more to say about this new Religious Association, but that will come in future newsletters.

Praise God that He is still opening doors for us to share the love of God with our brothers and sisters in Mexico.

### Education and Sports Can Transform the Lives of Children

In Mexico there are many traditions which are a time of celebration and togetherness for many families. Some of these are Baptisms and Confirmation. Not only are these a time of celebration but, for Christians, it also reminds us of the importance of becoming a member of the family of God, bringing us closer to each other and to Him.

This was the case at **San Pablo (St Paul)**, which is led by Pastor Abdiel Perez. The little church was filled with joy when ten children between the ages of 7 and 13 years old were confirmed and baptized in one service. Parents, friends, neighbors and relatives gathered together to accompany this group of children when they publicly confessed that they were members of the family of God.

Many of these children and their families have not had the opportunity to baptize their children because of economic reasons and they were not congregating at any church. However, with the support of the Project Joel Program through Cristo para Todas las Naciones and through the sports ministry which includes martial arts, many children that are part of Project Joel have become involved at San Pablo. In this way we work together to offer the younger population, which are more vulnerable, resources to stay away from risky behaviors and at the same time offer them new ways to grow in character. It is important for us to work together and connect families and children to God and to the church where they can learn more about His love.

In the same way, we work with children through the Angel Scholarship Program in order to support them with their education so they can continue in their studies, not to get discouraged and drop out of school due to lack of money.

My hope is that in this coming new year God will continue to bless our programs which directly help children and their families to be

strengthened, to learn everyday about God's love and to remain in God's caring hands.
