

Bible Institute Opening Ceremony

On March 4th, at 4:00 p.m. the **Instituto Biblico Luterano (Lutheran Bible Institute)** was officially open for classes in Tijuana! There was a well attended ceremony at **El Divino Salvador (Divine Savior) Lutheran Church**. There are 40 students enrolled for the first class. These students are members of different Lutheran churches near the California border. Some of them are lay pastors serving already in congregations. Most of them are people who want to be trained to serve the Lord. They have intentions to serve in churches, others to serve helping in our programs, like the building of houses or in the youth center, among others.



These are the first students enrolled at the Bible Institute! They are enrolled in the first class which is 'Introduction to the New Testament' which is being taught by Pastor Carl Lutz from San Diego, CA.

The classes are part in-classroom with a instructor and part self-study and group-study. The students meet with the instructor once a month, four times in the class duration of three months. The rest of the assignments are for homework and in group studies.

We give thanks to the Lord for this opportunity to help our brothers and sisters in Mexico by providing them the opportunity to receive formal biblical training. As we help people in Mexico with their physical needs, this new Bible Institute will help even more with meeting their spiritual needs.

We give thanks first to our Lord Jesus Christ and then to those who in one way or another helped to accomplish this important goal. Special thanks to Pastor Joseph Robb and **Transform San Diego**, for their donation to cover the scholarships for the students attending the first class. Within the Youth Center, I lead various activities, but the one I like the most is the sports ministry.

A couple of years ago, I started a martial arts class at the Youth Center. Since then, many have asked me what is the purpose of my work, is that class only for exercising, to help children lose weight or is it just something that will make them stronger? What good does that do?
