Pastor Josafat and his wife, Armandina, are so excited about this new lot and the community in Independencia is enjoying their new property, their own property! We pray that the Gospel of Jesus can be shared in this new location and the many plans for this neighbor-

hood can come to fruition with the help of our God and Savior.

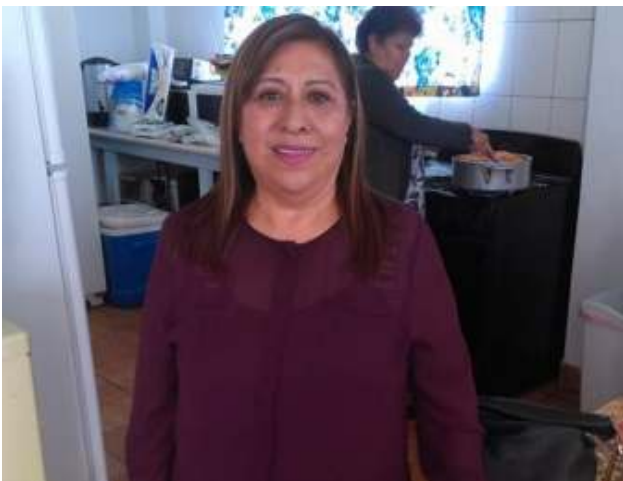
In the next months, we will be collecting quilts, blankets and socks for wintertime.
