



Angel Scholarship Program

Wherever Lutherans are in mission, there will be a concern for education because we believe God calls us to use our capacity and gifts for learning. In LBCM's work in Mexico, the opportunity exists to support families whose income may limit their child's participation in the public school system which requires uniforms, test fees, and more for its students. Some parents find themselves with a choice of feeding their children or providing for their education.

The Angel Scholarship Program was created to support families in the neighborhoods around the churches and to empower youth through volunteer service. Named after Pastor Angel Lanza, Lutheran pastor from Venezuela who began **El Redentor (Redeemer) Lutheran Church** in Tijuana and who tragically died at a young age, the program provides fees for secondary students who might otherwise need to leave school. Pastor Lanza's daughter, Legna, administers the program in cooperation with the local Lutheran churches in Mexico. Scholarship recipients volunteer in the Lutheran churches as part of the program, building social skills along with all that education provides. Through these gifts, scholarships are also provided for the children of the Lutheran ministry workers in Tijuana.

Gifts to the Angel Scholarship Program are sought so that we might expand this program. While we cannot meet all the needs in Tijuana, this program makes a difference in a child's life. Thank you for your support!
