It was a wonderful experience for everyone, good food was shared and the Lord was praised for the great blessing that the family was receiving, for meeting new friends and for a fabulous meal.

A few weeks after this mission trip, Mark, who had volunteered to help build the house, and I traveled to San Luis Rio Colorado to assess the damage to the roof at San Mateo (St Matthew) Lutheran Church from rain and wind from a storm in September. He mentioned to me that he would like to bring his family to Mexico to build a home for a family in need to give them a more stable place to raise their children. What a blessing! So many people helping others.

Mission teams and individuals coming through LBCM can travel across the border and make a difference in the lives of a family in need. The cost is reasonable: the materials to build a house costs \$1,850; lodging at one of the centers is \$15 per person per night; food, transportation and other misc. costs can vary depending on your plans.

During these trips, mission groups can participate in other projects as well, like building a church or youth center, making repairs, etc. For example, in November, Connecting Generations from Phoenix, Arizona along with other volunteers, made the repairs to the roof at San Mateo Lutheran Church.
