

Celebrating 50 Years of Ministry

In 2017, LBCM will be celebrating 50 years of ministry work in Mexico! And in 50 years many things have changed in the ministry, but one thing remains the same: the sharing of God's love, mercy and grace to those in need. Since I came to LBCM in November of 2010, I have seen changes of the direction of the ministry here at LBCM.

The ministry started with some ladies from Southern California that wanted to help the children in the canyon areas of Tijuana by giving the children clothes and shoes. This continued in late1960s and early 1970s.

By the late 1970s, there was an effort to reach Central America with theological literature. This literature was also used in the Baja California area in the late 1980s to train lay people to serve in the ministry.

In the early 1980's food distribution was big. Some days, three vans filled with food would cross the border two or even three days a week to give away food. Churches were being built and some houses, too. In the early 1990s and 2000s, the Angel Scholarship Program was added with more house building and other projects like building schools and clinics.

In the 2010s and to the present day, I have witnessed a new direction of the ministry and it is flourishing in new ways. Breakfast Programs are growing and there will be more starting soon. House building has extended to other locations beyond Tijuana. We are involved more and more with children's ministries. Even sewing classes have become an important part of ministry to ladies in the centers and congregations. A Bible Institute was

established and it is training people for the ministry not only for full time positions but also for lay people. I have seen people leaving us and even more people coming and helping to expand God's kingdom on this earth.
