#### **Musicians in Motion**

Gema, from Faith Lutheran Church, San Diego is a musician. She started a music program in Colonia 3 de Octubre teaching youth music. She became part of a collaboration called Musicos en Movimiento – Musicians in Motion. The following is information about the program written by Gema:

The First Collaboration Musicians in Motion - Music for peace: Art Toward Social Values was the result of 6 weeks of work in which three different groups of kids in the cities of Tijuana and Ensenada had the opportunity to be part of a workshop in which they learned basic aspects of music and performed Christmas carols in a three concerts final collaboration.

The process of preparation included weekly rehearsals where the main purpose was to encourage kids to participate as a group and to be responsible as essential members of that group, in order to make them at least curious and sensitive about the implications of social interaction. At the end of this short music program, they had the opportunity to perform a concert for each one of their communities.

The collaboration culminated in a wonderful event where 43 kids and their

families were greatly benefited, not only from "Musicians in Motion" artists' efforts and from the work of great people in Tijuana and San Diego, but also because of the support of Lutheran Border Concerns Ministry and members of Faith Lutheran Church in San Diego. As a result, children had the opportunity to perform at the University of Baja's Music Department in Ensenada, where they met the *Children's Flute Ensemble* from "Music for Peace" to present a few Christmas songs together (pictured below), for the joy of everyone present. This marvelous experience was followed by a small reception



where the kids also received Christmas presents and exchanged their experience with great enthusiasm.

Lutheran Border Concerns and members of Faith Lutheran Church together with artists and volunteers in Tijuana did a wonderful job supporting the realization of this collaboration; taking that as a starting point, we will continue to work towards music education and the teaching of human values as a means to contribute to children and youth's development in different communities of Baja California. We believe that eventually it will be more plausible for all of us to understand how relevant it is to responsibly commit to be fully cooperative in all of our social interactions, by being participative and insistent in projects that will increase the quality of our world.

It was a privilege for LBCM to support this program and we look forward to continue to help create the broadest impact in the lives of children, their families, churches and communities. We are advocates of good education and spiritual well being that connects with Jesus.
