They said yes and since December they have met with the children in a park that is close by. They feed the children breakfast and teach them Bible stories, crafts and enjoy games. Please pray for Mexicali; we have plans to expand the ministry in this city which is the capital of Baja and has a population of about 1 million people.



These children are enjoying breakfast at El Fronterizo, Sonora. Some of these children have no food or breakfast in the morning. Most of them have only one meal a day that consists of beans and tortillas. I can tell a difference in their appearance and energy level after being fed breakfast for a few months. We are now serving breakfast in eight established locations and two that are just getting started. We feel so blessed by Our Lord that with so little funds we are able to feed such a large number of children!
