Many parents are reached by building them a small 12' x 12' house. The cost of this house is \$1,850.00 (US). We talk about this in almost every newsletter because we believe that a decent house is necessary and needed for so many people in Mexico. I have seen from the outside and inside the house that people build with whatever they can find on the streets or the trash dump. Some of the families have little money and they use the old wooden garage doors as walls. These makeshift homes are not safe, the roof leaks, the doors are not secure and

the windows are broken or nonexistent. At LBCM, we pray to the Lord that many mission teams will make it to this border region to help build a nice, safe and warm new home for many families in need.



We also have given children a little bit of pleasure with toys and gifts at Christmas and other holidays. Nothing beats the feeling of seeing a little boy or girl opening their gifts with a big smile on their faces. We receive shoe boxes filled with small toys, gifts and sometimes candies. The children open these boxes with the expression of happiness on their faces! Toys and gifts remind us how God gave for and to us His most precious belonging, His only Son, Jesus Christ. These gifts and toys also encourage us to share the greatest love ever, the son of God, our Redeemer!
