Julio Sr., Kenia and little Julio Jr. (pictured above) live in El Maclovio area, on the east side of Tijuana. Julio Sr. and Kenia work in a factory that assembles furniture, about 2 miles from their home. Together they earn less than \$5000 a year as factory workers. Pastor JT and Mt Cross Lutheran Church, from Washington state, raised the funds for the building materials, about \$1850, and came over the summer and built the family a new house. This new house makes a big difference in their lives.

Little Julio is still a baby under a year old. His Grandmom and Aunt take care of him while his parents are at work; this helps his parents stretch their paycheck. This new home will help them financially, too. They don't have to worry about saving to build a home; they can save money instead for the little Julio for his healthcare and education.

During the home build, the children from the neighborhood came and they received school supplies and the girls received new dresses. It was a party for all during the dedication of the new home. What a blessing, all rejoicing in God's joy!

Many Needs

Jesus sends us where there is a need to share His love, mercy and peace.

Over the summer, while groups were sharing God's love by building homes for families in need, I had the privilege to be invited to visit Mexican organizations in Tijuana. All of them have many needs. Pequeno Mundo Especial (Special Little World) takes care of about 1000 children with disabilities. We were able to provide rice, beans and hygiene kits, thanks to Orphan Grain Train.

I also helped Mujeres con Cancer (Women with Cancer) that helps women with the resources to get them into treatment when these women have no medical insurance. I also noticed that they also help men to get treatment, too. We gave them blankets, medical supplies, walkers and a few other items. During one of the visits, I accidently brought school supplies. They happily took the school supplies and now they are giving school supplies to the children

of the women who are receiving treatments. Many ways to help and many blessings!

We have been blessed to provide scholarships to enable children to attend school. This is one of the best gifts one can give to a child to secure their future and enable them to pursue God's plan for their life. We have also been helping them with school supplies and breakfast programs.

We are now embarking upon a new project that will expand our efforts to help secure the future for more children across the border in Mexico. We feel called to do two things at once – consistently help more individual children stay in school and provide those of us on this side of the border the opportunity and blessing of helping an individual child. This new program will be called Angels Wings. We are hoping to help people spread their wings and help a child soar. As Child Services Coordinator, Janet Grosser, will be heading up this new program.

These new efforts will be focused on allowing an individual, family, class, congregation or group the means and privilege of supporting/sponsoring a child. A specific child can become your blessing and you can become their blessing. For about \$1 a day donation, you can become an answer to a child's prayer.

The support contributed to each child will be used for their school tuition, for items they need for school like books, uniforms and bus fare, as well as for feeding programs and the like.

All our other programs, including the Angel Scholarship Program and the Breakfast Program will continue as usual. Expect to hear more about this new program in the next newsletter.
