It is wonderful to see how the ladies can learn a skill which can lead to a job which can help support the family. When the father is the only source of income, perhaps less than \$3,000 dlls a year, the chance of the mother to add income to the family is a blessing. Also, the ability to sew and have access to a machine can save money. What if a clothing repair is needed; perhaps a zipper for the pants, no need to spend a couple of bucks to hire it done.

Another blessing of Angels Wings is the relationships made with those who make the several LBCM programs work. Both children are very active in their churches and help with the breakfast program in their respective place.
